

The Young Filipino-Canadian Leaders Summit came out of the following identified issues experienced, observed and studied by a focused group of Filipino-Canadian youth leaders:

- The need to foster understanding and bridge generation gaps between parents and their children, as well as among generations of Filipino/Filipino-Canadian youth from 1st, 1.5 and 2nd generations.
- The need to understand and address the invisibility of the Filipino community in Canadian society. Filipinos are the largest source of migrant labour in Canada. Filipinos are the 4th largest visible minority according to the 2006 Statistics Canada. Filipinos are one of the most highly educated immigrants migrating to Canada. However, it has been argued that due to de-skilling and devaluing of their education and work experience, as well as the experiences of discrimination and racism, Filipinos and their contributions to the Canadian society continue to be invisible.
- Despite many years of invisibility since the first major waves of Filipinos post 1960s, the children of
 those who first arrived and the youth who have come after, have started what has been dubbed as a
 renaissance of Filipino pride in Canada. Youth of Filipino descent are exploring with curiosity and
 enthusiasm: what it means to be Filipino in Canada; Philippine history, art, culture and heritage while
 trying to also understand their place in Canadian society.
